Connecticut Historic Preservation Project

The Connecticut Trust for Historic Preservation is investing in a new project called "Making Places, Historic Mills of Connecticut."



Staff of the trust are researching and preparing a database of at least 200 Historic Resource Inventories on industrial sites. The trust was awarded a grant of \$250,000 from the Connecticut Housing Finance Authority as the first major investment. The first step will be a survey of historic industrial complexes, mill villages, and industrial neighborhoods to update the 1981 SIA survey (which focused on sites between 1840 and 1910).

The new survey will extend the time frame to 1965. Future phases will include redevelopment plans and small grants to help utilize old mills.
